

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## Thanksgiving Turkey Booklet Instructions

### Why make a book with your child?

Making books is a fun craft to do with children. The activity illustrates to a child that stories come from somewhere and that language is important in both the spoken and written form. A child begins to associate printed letters with spoken words when he or she is exposed to them through reading, printing practice and watching adults make the letters. A book craft is the perfect opportunity for your child to explore the written word and spoken language.

### What you need:

1/2 piece of 8.5 X11 brown construction paper.

3 pieces of 8.5 X 11 sheets of white paper cut in half.

An elastic

One stick

Turkey book template

Other colours of construction paper if desired.

## Take Home Craft Kit Survey

### Directions for the book:

Fold a 1/2 of brown piece of paper in half to make the book. Fold the white pieces of paper in half and put inside the brown construction paper. Using a hole punch or sharp pencil, poke or punch a hole near the top and bottom of the left hand side of the booklet. Thread an elastic through the top hole, wrap around the stick and then thread the elastic through the bottom hole and wrap around the stick. This will hold the book together. Draw a story, colour the pictures and write the words.



### Hello Turkey

Using the turkey craft template, have the child colour the pieces. Should the child have scissor cutting skills, let the child cut out the pieces. Some pieces, for example, the maple leaves, maybe tricky and will require an adult's help.

Glue the small maple leaf to the center of the big maple leaf. Glue the eyes and beak to the big circle that is attached to the little circle. Attach the bow to the line between the big circle and little circle. The two oak leaves are the turkey's wings—glue those to either side of the small circle. Add the hat to the top of the big circle. Glue the feet to the bottom of the little circle. You should have a turkey like the one above.
